Arrival from the Airport

Franjo Tuđman Airport

Distance: approx. 15 km

Travel time: 25–40 minutes (depending on traffic)

Airport Shuttle Bus + Tram

1. Airport shuttle bus to **Zagreb Bus Station**: <https://plesoprijevoz.hr/>
2. Take tram **line 2 or 6** (direction Črnomerec): <https://maps.app.goo.gl/exKreYzVA8UEafYb9>
3. Get off at **Dom Sportova**
4. Walk approx. 5 minutes to the hotel

Total travel time: 50–60 minutes

Arrival by Train


Zagreb Glavni Kolod Train Station

Three options. Travel time 20–30 minutes including a 10–15-minute walk


- Tram 9 to Trešnjevački trg
- Tram 2 to HNK2
- Tram 4 to Studentski centar

Tram:

The most straight forward way is to descend on the 'Trešnjevački trg' tram station and walk down the 'Trakošćanska ulica' and 'Metalčeva ulica' north-wise for about 10 minutes.



To get to 'Trešnjevački trg' tram station, there are direct tram lines 3, 9 and 12 that should have 'Ljubljana' as the final destination. But if one can not take these directly, the best way is to arrive at either one of the 'Studentski centar' tram stations, and walk towards to the 'Tehnički muzej' one which is closer to the railway bridge, and then wait for the previously mentioned lines.



Public Transport – Useful Information

- Single ticket (30 min): approx. **€0.53**
- 90-minute ticket: approx. **€0.93**
- Tickets are available at Tisak kiosks, via mobile apps, or can be purchased directly from the tram driver.
- Trams run frequently (every 5–10 minutes during peak hours)
